Special Election for Webster Township voters in the Ann Arbor and Pinckney School Districts

Important Dates and Deadlines

- **October 21**
Last day to register to vote at locations *other than* in person at the township office
- **October 22 – November 5**
In person registration with Township Clerk (with proof of residency)
- **November 1**
Last day to request an Absentee Ballot to be *MAILED* to you
- **November 2 (Saturday)**
Additional Township hours, 9 AM – 5 PM, for in person pick up of ballots and registrations.
- **November 5**
Absentee Ballots obtained on *THIS* day must be voted at the township
- **November 6** - Special Election 7 AM – 8 PM
(Election Day Registrations need to have proof of residency)

Register to Vote

- You may register to vote in-person or via mail up to 15 days prior to Election Day. Then through, and including on, Election Day, people may register to vote in-person at the Webster Township Clerk's office with proof of residency.

Sign up for an Absentee Ballot!

- Any voter may apply to receive an Absentee Ballot. Voters must submit a signed Absentee Ballot Application before *EVERY* election. Complete your [Absentee Ballot Application](#) today.
- The Webster Township Clerk maintains a permanent list of voters who wish to receive a mailed Absentee Ballot Application for every election. Please contact us to be placed on this list.

Active Military and Citizens residing outside the U.S.

Federal laws provide additional accommodations to ensure that all U.S. citizens may register to vote, and cast ballots in each local election. Active duty military, their families, as well as any civilians residing outside the U.S., are able to cast their votes in their local elections via absent voter ballot.
