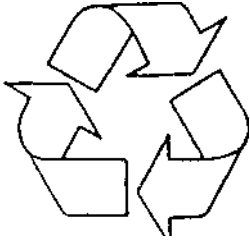


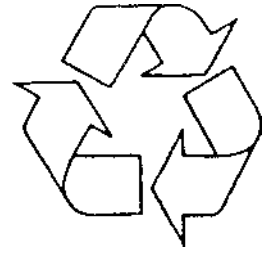

How to Recycle...

Material Preparation Procedures



Newspaper and Junk Mail Mix

- Newspapers and all glossy inserts are OK.
- Collect in a brown paper bag; secure with tape or string
- Keep dry for collection

Magazines, Catalogs, Paperback Books, and Phone Books

- Bag together, separate from newspaper mix (above)
- Collect in a brown paper bag; secure with tape or string

White Office Paper

- Bag separately from all other papers
- Collect in a brown paper bag; secure with tape or string

Cardboard, Cereal Boxes, and Paper Bags

- Flatten corrugated cardboard boxes and cut into 2' x 2' squares
- Flatten boxboard—such as cereal, tissue, and shoe boxes
- Brown paper grocery bags, or same paper bags to be used for recycling paper
- Consolidate in a paper bag separate from newspaper mix
- Staples and tape are OK

Plastic Bottles

- Only bottles please
- Bottles labeled #1 (PET) or #2 (HDPE) 3, 4, 5, 7
- Milk jugs, water, juice, and detergent bottles
- Butter/Yogurt type containers, kitty litter buckets
- No plastic bags separately
- No petroleum “oil based containers”
- Rinse well and flatten; labels may be left on
- Bag bottles or secure with a string

Glass Bottles and Jars

- Clear, green, and brown containers (no blue!)
- Green and brown glass may be mixed at the drop-off
- Rinse clean, labels may be left on
- Remove caps (recycle steel caps with cans!)
- No plates, china, ceramics, mirrors, or windows

Tin and Aluminum Cans

- Aluminum and steel cans and lids
- Remove labels, rinse out, and flatten if possible
- Empty aerosols are OK
- Car & Truck Batteries
- Small scrap metals and aluminum taken

Webster Township Recycling

Webster Township is partnering with Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority to provide the opportunity for Township residents to recycle paper, glass, plastic and cans. We have 2 large green recycle bins located on site at Webster Township Hall to serve your recycling needs. Please review the adjacent list to see what can be recycled. Only deposit the listed materials into the containers. If the containers are already filled, please take your recyclables home and bring them back another time. Motor oil cannot be dealt with at this site; therefore, refer to the note below to recycle your oil. Please do not leave other items that are not on the list since this program is not prepared to deal with anything not listed. This is a trial program for one year and we anticipate that it will be a success with your cooperation.

Used Motor Oil

WWRA collects and recovers waste oil to heat the processing facility. This unique program not only cuts down on hazardous waste, it also saves energy! WWRA accepts used motor, hydraulic, transmission, gear lube, and fuel oils for recycling. These oils may be dropped off at the WWRA recycling facility at 8025 Werkner Road in Chelsea, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Motor oil can also be taken to Bridgewater Tire, 8409 Boettner Road.
